MATRICULATION REQUIREMENTS

YOU are an ideal candidate if YOU are holding a professional or academic bachelor's degree in architecture or equivalent degree in related disciplines, or a professional certificate gained by completing bachelor studies (180 ECTS).

We encourage candidates and future leaders who are committed to an environmentally sustainable approach to the built environment. We embrace diversity and welcome students from all over the world, as well as different countries and backgrounds, and offer one fee for everyone.

All candidates requesting for admission to the first year of master's academic studies must present a portfolio. When enrolling in master's programme YOUR previous earned competencies, portfolio, and language expertise will be evaluated.

The candidate rank will be formed based on the sum of points of the parts listed below:

- The success in previously completed studies.
- The quality of the portfolio.
- The motivation.
- Interview.

Enrolment is completed when the first fee is paid.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

STEP 1 – ONLINE APPLICATION

The online application form must be submitted to University of Genoa. YOU will have to create an account to complete the online application. YOU may complete it in multiple sessions.

YOU will have to submit:

- **A Motivation Letter** highlighting why YOU would like to attend the chosen programme and explaining YOUR future academic and career goals;
- CV detailing YOUR educational background and professional experience, if applicable.
- **Portfolio** with maximum five (5) best projects done during the bachelor studies or workshops/internship/personal projects. Each project has a very brief description (200 words) technical drawings, schemes and images that are useful to understand the project itself.

Once YOU have filled in YOUR personal data and inserted the motivational statement the following documents will be needed:

- Copies of passport identification pages.
- YOUR previous education document copies or the most recent transcripts if final scores are not yet
 available (official final certificates and transcripts are required). Education documents must be
 accompanied by English translations of all certificates and transcripts along with approval of the
 document authenticity;
- **Proof** of English certificate or other acceptable information, according to the set language requirements by the University of Genoa.

NOTE! Before hitting the final SUBMIT button, please review YOUR application and attachments for accuracy one last time. If YOU have submitted all required information, and YOU are eligible to apply for the programme, YOU will be issued Conditional Acceptance letter.





STEP 2 – APPLICATION FEE

To proceed with further application the application fee must be paid. Application fee is **EUR 136** (partially non-refundable) per student. It contains a stamp duty and regional tax, payable upon confirmation of registration:

- stamp duty = Euro 16 (non-refundable)
- regional tax = Euro 120 minimum amount, to be settled by the next instalment date based on the ISEE-U value (for further information visit: https://www.studenti.unige.it/tasse/iseeuparificato/en/)

Online application will be processed only after application fee received. Applicant will receive an invoice with the needed details to make an international money transfer via bank when the online application is submitted.

For better service, candidates are requested to upload receipt of application fee payment to the online application system.

NOTE: Candidate pays all bank commission fees for international transfer.

STEP 3 – FINAL APPLICATION EXAMINATION

After receiving all required documents, the university sends those to ENIC/NARIC Center or equivalent center for evaluation. The ENIC/NARIC Center evaluates foreign qualifications. This process may take time up to 1 month. Several cases may take longer.

After YOUR educational documents are approved, an invitation for interview will be sent via online application system within 2 weeks.

Results on admission will be informed after all the above steps of application process have been done. Final admission decision is usually announced on average within 3 weeks' time.

ONLINE APPLICATION

- 1. Create an application.
- 2. Add YOUR personal details.
- 3. Indicate an email address that YOU regularly check, as it will be used for all communications related to the application process.
- 4. Upload the scans (not photos).
- 5. Fill in the application and upload the compulsory attachments including the admission assignment.
- 6. Submit YOUR application.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- 1. **Education documents** (diploma and official transcript of records). Education documents must be accompanied by English translations of all certificates and transcripts along with approval of the documents authenticity.
- 2. Proof of English proficiency.
- 3. Portfolio/CV.
- 4. Letter of Motivation.
- 5. Copy of the biodata page of YOUR passport or ID card (the document needs to be valid during the application process).
- 6. Admission assignment.

PROOF OF ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

If YOUR studies at secondary school or bachelor studies were in English Language, provide a confirmation letter from YOUR school, unless it states on YOUR secondary school certificate that medium of instructions were in English Language. Since YOU apply for master's programme YOU will be asked for online interview.

YOU have to provide the results of an internationally recognised test (see below). If YOUR previous studies were completed in English but in a country where English is not the native language, YOU must present an





official letter from YOUR previous educational institution stating that all of YOUR studies were completed in English (medium of instruction is English) and pass an interview in which the ECOBUILT will evaluate YOUR language skills. Applicants who have already received English education in one of the countries mentioned below do not need to prove separate language proficiency:

If YOU are foreigner that obtained secondary education in a country of the EU, the EEA, or the Swiss Confederation, and YOUR secondary education certificate includes an assessment of foreign language skills comparable to at least level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, an internationally recognised foreign language certificate is not required (CEFR).

ECOBUILT accepts the following internationally recognized language tests:

- 1. TOEFL IBT (Test of English as a Foreign Language) Internet-based: score of at least 72
- 2. TOEFL Essential at least 8 points
- 3. IELTS (International English Language Testing System): score of at least 5.5
- 4. CPE (Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English) / C2 Proficiency: any level
- 5. CAE (Cambridge Certificate of Advanced English) / C1 Advanced: any level
- 6. FCE (Cambridge English First Certificate in English) / B2 First: at least level B
- 7. PTE (Pearson Test of English) General: at least level B2
- 8. PTE (Pearson Test of English) Academic: at least 51 point
- 9. Language Cert International ESOL at least Level Communicator B2 (Written and Spoken exams)
- 10. Trinity Integrated Skills Test (ISE): ISEII, ISEII, ISEIV with a pass in each component.

If English is not YOUR mother tongue, YOU must submit confirmation of English language proficiency. YOU should submit one of the following certifications with a minimum score of (Table 2):

If none of the above apply, but YOUR secondary school studies were in English, deliver a letter of confirmation from YOUR school, unless YOUR secondary school certificate says that the medium of instruction was in English. In the event of any question, **ECOBUILT maintains the right to request the above-mentioned official language certificate.**

PORTFOLIO /CV

YOU should submit a CV and Portfolio containing the following information:

- 1. Personal and contact information (email and phone no).
- 2. Overview of education, indicating the higher educational institution, field of study, degree obtained and the theme of the graduation work/project.
- 3. Work experience, including the name of all employers of the past five years, job titles, duration of employment and description of the position and its responsibilities.
- 4. Language skills.
- 5. Computer and software skills.
- 6. Maximum five (5) best projects done during the bachelor studies or workshops/internship/personal projects accompanied by very brief description of the project (100 words), technical drawings, diagrams and images that allow us to understand the fundamental points of the project. Other activities, hobbies and interests.

MOTIVATIONAL LETTER

The motivation letter, which is essentially a short essay, is one of the most important components of YOUR application (in English, 2,000 characters maximum, including spaces).

Its purpose is to introduce YOURSELF, support YOUR application, and answer the question, "Why are YOU a suitable candidate?"

Here are some ideas to help YOU answer this question: Why did I decide to apply to this programme? What will I learn from my studies? What makes me a good candidate given my background? How would the programme assist me in achieving my objectives? Include an assessment of YOUR abilities in contributing to multicultural and cross-disciplinary team initiatives, as well as a vision of YOUR future ambitions.

NOTE! Any sources applied in the motivation letter must be properly cited and referenced (quotations, publications, ideas, etc. that are not YOUR own). Failure to follow reference and citation guidelines is considered plagiarism and will result in the rejection of YOUR application.





ADMISSION

YOU must complete an ECOBUILT- related admission assignment following the steps. Description provided here. Eligible candidates will be invited for interviews.

SELECTION CRITERIA

The ECOBUILT Admission Committee will evaluate YOUR application based on the following criteria:

- 1. YOUR academic quality (qualification), judged primarily by the results of previous university studies 40%
- 2. YOUR portfolio 30 %
- 3. YOUR motivation in terms of previous studies, work experience (if applicable), and future career plans in relation to ECOBUILT's objectives, as judged by the CV 20%
- 4. YOUR interview 10%

English language proficiency will be assessed by the submitted certificate (if applicable) and interview.

INTERVIEW

- 1. The interview will take place in real time through the Internet (Zoom or MS Teams). Each candidate's specific interview time will be communicated through e-mail.
- 2. Members of the ECOBUILT Admission Committee will ask the candidate additional questions based on the information given, motivation letter, and admission assignment. The interviews may also address the candidate's employment history. The applicant's motivation and general knowledge will be evaluated.

STUDY OFFER

After completing the interview, YOU will be provisionally admitted to ECOBUILT. List of selected candidates will be published ECOBUILT webpage: https://ecobuilt-project.org/.

Examine the conditional information. It contains a list of all the necessary documents, and deadlines! Please visit the section "Necessary Documents" in this document for further details.

FINAL ACCEPTANCE

The study agreement and the invoice for the tuition fee payment (if applicable) will be sent to candidates by email. The invoice includes money transfer details and a mandatory deadline for the payment to be made.

The final acceptance letter of candidate's admission to ECOBUILT will be issued after the university has received the first-year's tuition fee payment in full (if applicable).

NOTE! ECOBUILT organizes only one student intake a year - for the next autumn semester.





APPEAL PROCEDURE

At this point, there is no opportunity to dispute the final list of selected applicants unless there is a particular procedural error by the ECOBUILT Admission Committee during the application process.

Please carefully study the Selection Criteria as well as the Application Procedure before submitting an appeal.

- 1. Applicants who do not submit the required documentation by the dates should not submit an appeal.
- 2. Applicants who followed the application procedure and fulfilled the deadlines but were denied because they did not meet the selection criteria and have reasons to think that a mistake was made during the selection process have the right to appeal the ECOBUILT Admission committee's decision.

The request for reconsideration procedure corresponds with how YOUR proposal was managed during the assessment and eligibility of review processes. It is not another assessment that occurs automatically. Please keep in mind that any additional information or clarifications that should have been included in YOUR proposal will be rejected.

If, after reading the following criteria, YOU still think a mistake was made, please write an email to contact@ecobuilt-project.org for revision by the ECOBUILT Admissions' Committee. All appeals must be filed 36 hours before publishing preliminary rang list. The outcome of the appeal will be notified to the applicant before publishing a final rang list. If no one appeals, the preliminary rang list becomes a final list.





NECESSARY DOCUMENTS

Once YOU arrive for studies, YOU must submit original documents to the ECOBUILT programme coordinator.

International mobility sector https://rubrica.unige.it/strutture/struttura/100320 will do a document check and approve that documents are original.

WHAT DOCUMENTS TO INCLUDE?

- 1. 2 signed copies of study agreement;
- 2. original of Bachelor's diploma in the original language;
- 3. officially certified copy of academic transcripts in the original language;
- 4. authorized translation in English of Bachelor's diploma (if the originals are not issued in English);
- 5. authorized translation in English of academic transcripts (if the originals are not issued in English);
- 6. simple copy of passport identification pages (created by a photocopier).

Please ensure the following:

- Official translations of education documents in English are supplied.
- Alternatively, bachelor level documentation can be electronically provided to the e-mail contact@ecobuilt-project.org straight from the university that issued the degree. If the institution is unable to supply the documents in English or if the English version is missing, then YOU must transmit official English translations to the e-mail address contact@ecobuilt-project.org separately.

Please keep in mind that all necessary documents must be properly prepared and delivered to us in one full set immediately after arrival. The applicant is responsible for delivering the needed documents on time.

Please keep in mind that application documents (except original education document) will not be returned.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

If YOU are in YOUR last year of studies, are still in the process of finishing the last bachelor's semester, and have not yet acquired a diploma, YOU can submit YOUR application with provisional results from YOUR institution. In this situation, YOU must complete the following:

- Application before the 1st of May (for EU and non-EU candidates).
- Enrolment before 1st of October

Rather than submitting a degree certificate, YOU must submit YOUR own statement about YOUR degree to the UniGe application's system, which must include the following information:

- 1. interim transcript;
- 2. confirmation letter from the school with the expected date of graduation;
- 3. other relevant information concerning YOUR graduation;

If YOU have been accepted into the ECOBUILT, YOUR final education documents must be received at the University of Genoa by YOUR arrival soon as possible, and no later than 1st of September. Please ensure that documents are delivered by the deadline. If YOU do not finish YOUR degree or produce the required documents by the deadline, YOUR study offer will be withdrawn.





RESIDENCE PERMIT

After the final acceptance, YOU will have to prepare YOUR documents for the residence permit to start YOUR studies.

IMMIGRATION REGULATIONS IN SERBIA

Entering the Country and Temporary Stay Permit

Foreign citizens must register their residence in Serbia with the local police station within 24 hours of their arrival. A hotel, hostel or student dormitory will automatically complete it on students behalf. If students are staying at private housing, they should visit the police station with their landlord to register residence. Erasmus Student Network (ESN) can help incoming students with this procedure. All information on regulations and procedures regarding visas and the authorisation of temporary stay of foreigners in Serbia are available online on the website of the Ministry of Interior of the Republic of Serbia: www.mup.gov.rs

ENTRY VISA

There are many holders of foreign passports who do not need an entry visa for Serbia. However, to make sure whether students require an entry visa for Serbia, they should contact the nearest diplomatic, consular mission of the Republic of Serbia in the country of residence. Even though nationals of some countries (not everyone) may enter the Republic of Serbia with their ID cards only, international students and staff are required to have with themselves their valid passports to be able to obtain mandatory authorisation of temporary stay. Therefore visitors are strongly recommended to use it when entering the country as well. Information on general visa requirements and on general entry requirements can be found at the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Serbia: www.mfa.gov.rs/en/consular-affairs/entry-serbia/entering-serbia-requirements





Visa applications should be submitted to the Embassy or Consulate General of the Republic of Serbia abroad. Also, suppose students have any questions or concerns regarding entering the RS or temporary stay as student/staff. In that case, UB strongly recommends contacting the nearest diplomatic-consular mission of the Republic of Serbia for help. Please visit the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Serbia to see the list of Serbian embassies around the www.mfa.gov.rs/en

TEMPORARY STAY

As an academic exchange visitor, students will need to obtain their temporary stay visa (residence permit) for legal stay in the Republic of Serbia during the exchange. After registering at the International Relations Office of the University of Belgrade, students are obliged to register the Office for Foreigners of the Ministry of Interior, submitting the following:

- 2 photos
- Certificate from the University of Belgrade
- Certificate from the Ministry of Education
- Certificate from the faculty of the University of Belgrade (the school you will be attending)
- Form No. 8 (request for issuing a temporary stay visa for foreign citizens in Serbian: Zahtev za izdavanje boravišne vize za strance) 3 copies, printed two-sided
- Proof of Accommodation (a certificate from the housing provider /hostel, dormitory, etc/, or personal presence of the flat owner in case of a private accommodation)
- CV in Serbian (The MIA RS Office for Foreigners reserves the right to ask for any additional documents, information or payments)







FEES AND FINANCE

The ECOBUILT study programme has been awarded the status of Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters (EMJM) programme and has received financial support from the European Union. Considering this study fee is 4000 EUR per year (Table 3).

ECOBUILT consortium can annually award the Erasmus Mundus scholarships (Table 3) in the amount of 1400 EUR / month and completely waive the study fee for 16 students of excellence originating from European Union, the third countries associated to the Erasmus+ Programme**, and the Neighbourhood East countries***, as well as to 5-6 students annually originating from certain other parts of the world****.

- ** North Macedonia, Iceland, Norway, Serbia, Liechtenstein, Turkey.
- *** Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova, Territory of Ukraine as recognised by international law.
- **** Region 1 Western Balkans, Region 3 South-Mediterranean countries, Region 5 Asia, Region 6 Central Asia, Region 9 Sub-Saharan Africa, Region 10 Latin America

EC recommendations concerning students' involvement into the EMJM study programmes will be applied.

Access to campus facilities

YOU will be registered at all three universities during YOUR studies. YOU will have access to the same facilities as local students: library, computer rooms, laboratories, IT services, and student organizations. YOU will be invited to all activities organized for international students.

During process of enrolment, YOU will receive an ID number that will be used to access University e-mail, Microsoft software's, software's discount for students, access to Wi-Fi.

Housing

The Host Institution will assist YOU in YOUR search for housing and will offer accommodation in its student residence, whenever possible.

Residence Requirements

If needed, the Host institution will assist YOU in obtaining visa or residence permit, which is a requirement to take part in the Joint Degree Programme, and convey all necessary documents to prepare their application.

Healthcare

YOU must enrol in a health insurance plan according to the Host Institution's policy.

The Consortium of ECOBUILT Universities will provide the minimum required level of the obligatory insurance to YOU, respecting the minimum requirements for the health and accident insurance, transfers abroad and civil liability and respecting any local legislation as far as insurance is concerned in the framework of didactic activities of the Master programme.

Special Needs

Throughout the implementation of the ECOBUILT Programme, special focus will be made on promoting the benefits of diversity, inclusive language, culturally responsive education, and inclusivity. Throughout the curriculum, physical accessibility, multi - modal teaching and learning facilities, and assessment access arrangements will be offered. Students with special needs must be provided with the required accommodations, services, and supports.





ACADEMIC CALENDARS

1st semester at University of Genoa, Italy.

The first semester in the University of Genoa starts on the third week of September and finishes at the end of the second week of December, here starts with Christmas holidays that ends on the third week of January. The period dedicated to exams starts immediately after and lasts for the whole month of January.

2nd semester at University of Belgrade, Serbia.

The second semester in the University of Belgrade starts on the second week of February and ends at the beginning of June (with the holidays in February, orthodox Easter holiday week); the Exam period starts in June and last until the mid of July.

3rd semester at Riga Technical University, Latvia.

The third semester in Riga Technical University starts at the 1st Monday of September and it is 16 weeks long. Christmas holiday follows week 16 and it is 1 week long. The counting of weeks continues after Christmas holiday. Exam session starts at the beginning of January in the 1st Monday after Christmas holiday and is 4 weeks long.

4th semester at University of Genoa, Italy.

The fourth semester starts in Genova in the end of January and last until the beginning of May. Master Thesis defence is at the mid of July, and students must attend in presence.

4th semester at University of Belgrade, Serbia.

The fourth semester in Belgrade starts on the second week of February and ends at the beginning of June. Master thesis and project defence is at mid-July and must be attended by the student in presence.

4th semester at Riga Technical University, Latvia.

The fourth semester in Riga starts at the beginning of February and is 16 weeks long, until the end of May. Master thesis defence is at the mid of June, and students must attend in presence.





CURRICULUM




Figure 1. ECOBUILT Curriculum

ECOBUILT is an innovative joint master's study programme that emphasises integrative research and cross-specialization in an eco-friendly built environment. We will help YOU become an ECOBUILT pioneer capable of facilitating change in built environment via strategic thinking, management, and creative leadership. ECOBUILT curriculum is showed in the Figure 1.

STUDY PROGRAMME PLAN

It is planned that each year, around 15 students will be admitted to the programme, providing individualized and bespoke approaches to the learning process as well as close collaboration between students and teaching experts in the field. ECOBUILT has strong industry connections, ensuring opportunities for investigation, design, and testing with relevant corporation partners on study subjects and projects in Latvia, Italy, and Serbia.

SEMESTER 1

Mobility to Genoa, Italy / Enrolment

The 1st Semester YOU will attend classes in Genoa (Table 8). Genoa is a medium-sized city where student exchanges are intense; it has a vibrant cultural life, and a rich and still partly unexplored architectural history. From Genoa it is possible to reach larger cities such as Milan, Turin, and Florence, in a day trip; or Rome, Bologna and Venice only a little farther away.

The school is located in the heart of the medieval city, in an ancient convent restored in 1989 by Ignazio Gardella, and offers ample space and modern requirements. The Master programme have a small number of students, with a very good teacher-student ratio.

The curriculum starts with a deep immersion into the eco-friendly design process (Table 8), in order to clarify the core problems of the discipline with the contribution of specialized approaches and with international experiences.

SEMESTER 2

Mobility to Belgrade, Serbia

YOU will spend the third semester of YOUR studies in Belgrade (Table 9). Belgrade (Beograd) is the capital of Serbia, and has a population of around 1.6 million. It is situated in South-Eastern Europe, on the Balkan Peninsula, at the confluence of the Sava and Danube rivers. It is one of the oldest cities in Europe and has since ancient times been an important focal point for traffic, an intersection of the roads of Eastern and Western Europe.

The University of Belgrade is the oldest university in Serbia and the largest in this part of Europe. Founded in 1808, it consists of 31 faculties, 11 research institutes, 13 University centres, Computer Center and the University Library with more than 3.500.000 volumes. The Faculty of Architecture (1948) itself is a preeminent school for studies in Architecture and Urbanism in South-Eastern Europe. The Faculty has more than 1300 students, 150 teaching staff and 30 independent researchers.





The second semester is dedicated to the methods and tools (Table 9) with a focus to multiscale and problem-based design including biophilic design, circular design, nature-based solutions, regenerative and salutogenic design.

SEMESTER 3

Mobility to Riga, Latvia

YOU will spend the third semester of YOUR studies in Riga (Table 10). Riga, Latvia's capital city is located along the Baltic Sea at the mouth of the Daugava River. It is a cultural hub, with numerous museums and performance halls. The city is also famous for its wooden buildings, art nouveau architecture, and medieval Old Town. The old town of Riga is a UNESCO World Heritage Site known for its Art Nouveau/Jugendstil architecture and 19th-century timber buildings.

RTU, founded in 1862, is the largest science-based university in the Baltic States. Riga Technical University is located in the centre of Riga, Latvia's capital city. Latvia, along with Germany, Sweden, and other nations, has a border with the Baltic Sea. RTU has a long tradition of scientific achievement, with Nobel Prize winners, Presidents, and Prime Ministers among its previous professors and students. RTU is a fully accredited, internationally recognised European university with nine faculties.

RTU is Latvia's first higher education school, launching the building of its campus in Ķīpsala in 1965. The work is still ongoing, but already a majority of university students have been educated at the Ķīpsala Campus. When completed, the RTU campus will be the most advanced engineering study centre in the Baltic States.

The third semester is dedicated to the strategies and tactics (Table 10) in architecture with a focus to restoration and reconstruction of buildings through the prism of materials science in eco-friendly built environment.

INTERNSHIP

YOU will be encouraged to do YOUR internship during summer at the end of the first year or during the fourth semester during development of the Master's Thesis, from one (1) to three (3) months of internship, according to Module Catalogue.

It can be done in an architecture studio, appropriate scientific research institutions, in organizations for performing innovation activities, in organizations for providing infrastructural support to innovation activities, in companies and public institutions.





ASSESSMENT PROCEDURES AND GRADING SYSTEMS

YOU will have to complete the study programme ECOBUILT by earning 120 ECTS, through exams, laboratories and Thesis defence according to curriculum. Following the study programme plan, YOU must earn a specific number of ECTS in specific subjects, to have a complete knowledge and be awarded with the degree (see Study Programme Plan in this document).

Each subject has a specific number of ECTS according to students' workload. Each ECTS corresponds to 25 h of work. YOUR progress will be monitored during classes, but the evaluation will be done during the exam at the end of the course.

The following fundamental concepts will be observed while assessing the acquisition of the study curriculum.

- openness of knowledge and skills assessment a set of requirements for positive assessment of study achievements will be determined in accordance with the set goals and objectives of the programme, as well as the goals and objectives of the study courses;
- the principle of compulsory assessment it is necessary to obtain a positive assessment of the acquisition of the compulsory content of the programme.

An exam will be the most basic form of programme acquisition evaluation.

YOUR assessment will be carried out in accordance with the national legislations and approved methodological recommendations of each ECOBUILT university, and YOU will be required to get acquainted and perform in accordance with them depending on where the studies will take place.

Italy: It is regulated by the Regolamento didattico di ateneo D.R. n. 1281 del 28.03.2022, published the 29.03.2022. Marks are in a scale of 30. 30 cum laude is the maximum mark that can be achieved. From 0 to 17 it is insufficient and the subject has not passed, the student must re-do the exam. It is not necessary to reattend the class, except for laboratories. 18 is sufficient.

The result of the examination is recorded, with the mark obtained, on the spot. If the examination involves written tests, the student has the right to see his papers before the result of the examination is recorded. In the event that the examination does not conclude with an oral test, the result of the test is notified to the student electronically: the deadlines for viewing and discussing the paper with the teacher as well as the deadlines for official registration are governed by the University regulations for students.

Serbia: The student earns points in a subject through the work during lessons and by fulfilling the pre-examination obligations and taking the exam. Student's success in mastering a particular subject is continuously monitored during classes and expressed by points. The minimum number of points a student can achieve by completing pre-examination obligations is 30, and the maximum is 70. The maximum number of points a student can earn in a subject is 100.

Pre-examination obligations for students are realized in different ways, depending on the type and content of the subject per study programme: tests, colloquiums, evaluation of exercises, presentation, workshops, etc. Attending knowledge tests during the semester is compulsory. The exam form and points acquisition rules are adapted to the subject education field. The exam can include written or oral form, seminar paper, semester elaborate of the project, or exercises essays with an oral defence, etc., appropriately chosen according to the type of subject and content of the course.





The student's assessment is based on the total number of points that a student has earned by fulfilling the preexamination obligations and taking the exam according to the quality of the acquired knowledge and skills.

Student's overall success in the subject is expressed by grades 5 (failed) to 10 (excellent), following the Rulebook on Student evaluation on Exams (Gazette of the University of Belgrade, No. 136, 168 and 180).

Each subject from a study programme has a precise and published method of earning points. The way of earning points during teaching includes the number of points a student receives based on each type of activity during the course or by fulfilling the pre-examination obligations and taking the exam.

Latvia: The acquisition of the programme is graded on a 10-point scale in both the exam and the final examination. The level of acquisition of the programme, which is not lower than 4 (almost satisfactory), is considered positive.

The lecturer, fixing it in the calendar plan of the study course, determines criteria for knowledge assessment in study courses, examination form and procedure. Calendar plans are issued to students at the beginning of the semester.

In developing the evaluation criteria, the lecturer relies on the Cabinet Regulation No. 240 "Regulations on the State Academic Education Standard", the RTU approved methodological recommendations "Assessment of Study Quality at RTU", RTU Regulation on the Assessment of Study Outcomes and Regulation on Final Examinations at RTU".

IN CASE OF FAILURE

If YOU fail courses, YOU must repeat the appropriate tests and meet the entrance or evaluation committee's criteria. If necessary, the ECOBUILT universities will work to conduct remote catch-up examinations.

THESES DEFENCE

Minimum 10 days before defending the Master's thesis, YOU must have successfully passed all the exams completed laboratory work, developed the required study works, etc. according to study programme.

At the end of the studies, YOU will have to develop a master's thesis with an integrated diploma project on a current topic of environmental creation and development, in which the YOU will prove the knowledge and skills acquired during the studies. The master's thesis with an integrated diploma project is defended at an open meeting of the State Examination Commission. The commission consists of both ECOBUILT universities teaching staff and representatives of the profession.

DEGREE AWARDING

Each ECOBUILT institution determines whether YOU have met all of the prerequisites for a degree based on its own internal criteria. Each ECOBUILT university gives YOU credit transfer from the other institution in accordance with the applicable rules, laws, and regulations.

YOU must have defended a master's thesis with the following minimum grades in order to be awarded a Joint Master's degree in Architecture: Latvia -5 (five), Serbia 6 (six) -51/100 points, Italy -66/110 points.
